AARP Tax Preparation Appointments

Volunteer AARP preparers will once again be at the Center on Tuesday and Thursday each week to help members complete and file their 2012 Federal and IL tax returns. Tax preparation appointments are now available for all dates beginning Tuesday, February 5. AARP volunteers are trained and tested in current tax law using materials from the IRS. They can complete most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules. However, please see a professional tax preparer for complicated returns. Daily Drop-In Activities

The following activities are available whenever the Center is open, Monday through Friday, 8:30-4:30. It's all free; no need to sign up!

Wellness Matters!

The flu season has hit particularly hard this year. Please take the time to read some good prevention advice included below that applies to time at the Center or elsewhere. Every room in the Center has hand sanitizer and tissues for your use.

1. Follow the "six-foot rule" with anyone who seems sick. When someone with the flu coughs, sneezes, or even talks, the virus is expelled via respiratory droplets—and this is the most frequent way people become infected.

2. Wash your hands often—after you shake hands, for example, or handle an object someone else was using, such as a computer keyboard or phone. When you can't wash with soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand cleaner.

3. When out in public, try to avoid touching your lips, nose, or eyes, unless you've just washed your hands.

4. If you do get the flu, stay home so you don't infect others (typically, adults are contagious for about a day before symptoms begin and for about five days after; children longer). If you have to go out and need to cough or sneeze but have no tissue, do it into your sleeve or the crook or your arm, rather than into your hand or the air.
