



On Tuesday, August 6th @ 11:15 all members who've signed up should meet at Pottawatomie Park for the private cruise and lunch. #### Stevens St. Road Construction

If you've visited the Center recently, you know that road construction has made access to the Center from Stevens St. challenging at times. As soon as water main improvements are finished between 1st St. (II. Rt. 31) and 6th St. on Stevens, that segment of Stevens will be repaved and access will be restored. An alternative to the Stevens St. entrance is the parking lots off II. Rt. 31 by the miniature golf course and playground. To use those parking lots turn off of II. Rt. 31 onto North St. (one block north of Stevens). A walking path winds around from the parking lots to the Center. Follow that path to the entrance to the tennis courts; turn right and the path will take you right to our front door. Thank you for your patience!
