AARP Tax Preparation Appointments

Volunteer AARP preparers will once again be at the Center on Tuesday and Thursday each week to help members complete and file their 2013 Federal and IL tax returns. Tax preparation appointments are now available for all dates beginning Tuesday, February 4. AARP volunteers are trained and tested in current tax law using materials from the IRS. They can complete most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules. However, please see a professional tax preparer for complicated returns. For a specific list of tax forms that can be completed by the AARP preparers, please contact the Center. There is no cost for this service. Appointments are required. Senior Assessment Exemption and Freeze

Kane County residents 65 years of age or older may be eligible to receive the senior assessment exemption, a reduction of \$5000 in the Equalized Assessed Value of their property. To be eligible, a property must be the principal residence of the owner, and the owner must be 65 or older by December 31 of the tax assessment year. In addition to the senior assessment exemption, the senior assessment freeze effectively freezes your assessment at a base year causing your net assessment not to increase. This does not freeze your taxes, only your assessment. To be eligible, a property must be the principal residence of the owner for the beginning of two consecutive years, and the owner must be 65 or older by December 31 of the tax assessment year and meet certain household income requirements. The maximum household income for this exemption is \$55,000. Applications for both the senior assessment exemption and the freeze are available at the Kane County Supervisor of Assessments office and for download at www.KaneCountyAssessments.org. The Center office will also have copies of both applications.
