The Center will be closed on Labor Day Monday, September 1st 2014


Mission Statement

Since buying her work by chance at auction, amateur historian John Maloof has crusaded to put this prolific photographer in the history books. Maier's strange and riveting life and art are revealed through never-before-seen photographs, films, and interviews with dozens who thought they knew her. It has a running time of 1:30 hours.

Arlington International Racecourse Trip

The history of **Arlington International** spans more than 80 years. Described as "the most beautiful track in America", Arlington began Thoroughbred racing on October 13, 1927, when more than 20,000 fans braved the cold weather to celebrate the event in high style. On **Thursday, August 14 at 11:15** we'll depart the Center for **Arlington International**. Comfortable, round-trip coach transportation will be provided. Our group will have reserved outdoor "wicker" box seats with commanding views of the track all under the shelter of a cantilevered roof. A Bistro box lunch will be provided with a choice of sandwich (grilled vegetable flatbread, chicken pesto focaccio, pork barbecue),



Chopped Vegetable Salad, Potato Salad, chocolate chip cookie, Kettle Chips, assorted whole fruit, and drink. You will also receive a Daily Racing Guide.
