Did you know that Scrabble was invented by an out-of-work architect who was a victim of the Great Depression? In 1933, Al-

fred Mosher Butts attempted to create something that combined chance and skill entwining the elements of anagrams and the classic



crossword puzzle into a scoring game. Over the next 15 years, the game and name were refined with Scrabble being trademarked in 1948. Some form of Scrabble is now found in three out of every five American homes. We'd like to start a regular Scrabble group at the Center.
