# Make Your AARP Tax Preparation Appointment Soon

Volunteer AARP preparers are at the Center on Tuesday and Thursday each week to help members complete and file their 2014 Federal and IL tax returns. Tax preparation appointments are now available. AARP volunteers are trained and tested in current tax law using materials from the IRS. They can complete most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules. However, please see a professional tax preparer for complicated returns. For a specific list of tax forms that can be completed by the AARP preparers, please contact the Center. **There is no cost for this service.** Appointments are required. Call 630/232-3602 to make an appointment.

#### Daily Drop-In Activities
