The filing date (April 18) for tax returns is approaching fast. If you would like to have your returns prepared by one of the AARP volunteer preparers, you must call soon. Some remaining dates in April are already filled. Most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules can be completed. However, please see a professional tax preparer for complicated returns. A photo ID (driver's license, State ID, passport), social security card, copies of last year's tax returns, all forms W-2 and 1099, and any other information specific to your tax situation must be presented at your appointment. There is no cost for this service. However, appointments are required. Call 630/232-3602 with questions or to make an appointment.
