Caregiver Counseling at the Center

If you are an adult family member or individual who provides unpaid in-home services to a senior aged 60+, a person aged 19 -59 with Alzheimer's Disease or related neurological or organic brain disorder, or a grandparent or older individual (aged 55 years and older) who is a relative caregiver or primary caregiver, Debbie Miller (a licensed clinical social worker with Senior Services Associates, Inc.) will be at the Center on Friday, March 9 to provide free, private, individual counseling. Self-care is so very important for individuals doing the challenging work of caregiving! Appointments are required; call the Center at 630/232-3602 to schedule a time.

For more than ten years, the Center has partnered with the Salvation Army Golden Diners to offer a hot lunch and salad bar to Center members on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday each week. A couple of weeks ago, we were informed by the Salvation Army that they would no longer be providing home-delivered meals or running the numerous congregate lunch sites like the one at the Center. Their last day of operation is Wednesday, February 28. A new organization will be taking over some of the current operation. However, we have not yet been contacted by the new group with details of their program. To fill the gap, beginning March 1 the Center will offer a sandwich lunch Monday - Friday as we seek information from the new provider. As many of you know, the Center began offering a Monday and Friday Subway lunch a while ago to ensure that lunch was available five days a week. Don't hesitate to call the Center with questions.
