Milwaukee Art Museum Trip

The Milwaukee Art Museum received lots of votes from our members when we asked whether there was interest last month. We plan to travel to Wisconsin on Wednesday, October 23 to experience all this museum has to offer. With a history dating back to 1888, the Milwaukee Art Museum's Collection includes over 31,000 works from antiquity to the present, encompassing painting, drawing, sculpture, decorative arts, prints, video art and installations, and textiles. The Museum's collections of American decorative arts, German Expressionist prints and paintings, folk and Haitian art, and American art after 1960 are among the nation's finest. The Milwaukee Art Museum is also an architectural landmark, comprised of three buildings designed by three legendary architects: Eero Saarinen, David Kahler, and Santiago Calatrava. A building addition in 1975 by David Kahler provided more gallery space for the expanding Collection, and in 2001, architect Santiago Calatrava designed the Quadracci Pavilion, which not only provided what was now the Milwaukee Art Museum with greater public gathering space, but also gave the city of Milwaukee a new, international icon. The Center will provide luxury coach bus transportation that will tentatively depart the Center at 9:30am for the approximately two-hour trip to Milwaukee. The cost of transportation and museum admission is \$45. Lunch will be on your own. Two restaurants are located within the museum. Please sign up by Friday, Sept. 20; we need a minimum of 25 people.

As the mystery of its contents unfolds, Ruth is pulled into the past, into Nao's drama and her unknown fate, and forward into her own future. Geneva Township is once again sponsoring a free flu shot clinic. The clinic is scheduled for **Monday, Oct. 14 (Columbus Day) from 9:00 to 12:00 noon**. Nurses from the Visiting Nurses Association of Fox Valley (VNA) will administer the shots. Seniors signed up for Medicare Part B will have the cost of their flu shots covered by Medicare. Please bring your Medicare card. Geneva Township will pay the cost of the flu shot for any Geneva Township resident age 55+ not covered by Medicare Part B. For all others, the cost of the flu shot is \$35.00. Payment must be in the form of cash or check only. As always, free refreshments will be served.
